

Festival Eucharist for Trinity Sunday

The Festival Eucharist will celebrate the importance that music has at All Saints'. Music sung by our superb parish choir will highlight Trinity Sunday. This joyful and vibrant service will open with Nicholas Edwards's haunting *Introit for Trinity Sunday*. The setting of the Mass will be Francis Grier's *Missa Trinitatis Sanctae* written for Martin Neary and the Choir of Westminster Abbey. Peter Philips's *Jubilare Deo* will emphasise the importance of this day in the church's year and there will be well-known hymns for all to sing. Do join us for this festive occasion.

Julie Boden – poet

Julie was born in Sutton Coldfield, England in 1960. A former teacher and Creative Advisor for Creative partnerships she has, for the last ten years, worked full time as a poet. She is Midlands-based and travels nationally and internationally delivering workshops, conducting readings, performing, lecturing and judging poetry competitions. She is a Birmingham Poet Laureate (2002-2003), Director of Poetry Central, Poet in Residence at Symphony Hall, a Director of Warwick Words Festival, Founder of the Oasis Café Theatre and a Fellow of Hawthornden. Julie will read from her forthcoming publication 'Love in Leamington', talk about her life in the county and lead a discussion about poetry and her career.

William Petter - tenor

William began his musical training as a chorister at New College, Oxford, under Edward Higginbottom. He trained at the Royal Academy of Music, for which he gained the highest award, distinction with DipRAM, and a foundation prize. He also took the LRAM teaching diploma, for which he gained a distinction. He studies with Jennifer Dakin, and receives coaching from Ian Partridge. He now works mainly as an oratorio soloist and singer in Europe and has recently sung with conductors including Esa Pekka Salonen and Simone Young. William will present Schumann's Liederkreis op 39 and songs by Brahms, Wolf and Schubert.

Steve Walwyn and Friends Rhythm & Blues

Steve is one of this country's foremost sought after Rhythm and Blues guitarists. After playing with Hands Off, he joined professional rock band Chevy. A stint with Rhythm & Blues band The DTs in the early 1980s led him to join Dr Feelgood in 1989. He travels Europe playing over 200 gigs a year with Dr Feelgood. He has recently formed Steve Walwyn and Friends, a band dedicated to getting back to the roots of Rhythm and Blues.

Our Performers

Adam Tunnicliffe - tenor

Canadian tenor Adam Tunnicliffe studied at Christ Church, Oxford and at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. He sings regularly with the English Touring Opera and recent roles have included Alfredo in La Traviata for Garden Opera, Don Basilio in The Marriage of Figaro and Oberon in Kate Pearson's children's opera The Starry Welkin. Adam will be singing a programme of English songs by Stanford, Howells, Finzi, Quilter, Ireland, Warlock and Britten.

Martin Neary - organ

Organist and Director of Music at Winchester Cathedral from 1972 to 1988 and Organist and Master of the Choristers at Westminster Abbey from 1988 to 1998, Dr Martin Neary read Theology and Music at Cambridge University. Whilst at Westminster Abbey he directed the funeral service for Diana, Princess of Wales, for which he was appointed a Lieutenant of the Royal Victorian Order (LVO) in the New Year Honours List in 1998. Martin will present a recital with works by de Grigny, J S Bach, McCabe, Stainer, Howells, Farrington and Franck.

Chris Farr - harpsichord

Chris Farr began his musical career as a chorister at Westminster Abbey. He later studied organ and harpsichord at Trinity College of Music, London, under John Webster and Christopher Wood. In 1968 he moved to the Netherlands to study harpsichord with Gustav Leonhardt. Since 1971, when he was a prize winner at the Bruges early music competition, he has given many concerts in almost all the countries of Europe, as well as Israel, Canada and Japan, on harpsichord, organ, clavichord and pianoforte. He was professor of harpsichord at the Conservatoire in Zwolle and a resident accompanist at the Royal Conservatoire in The Hague, both in the Netherlands. Chris is now organist and choirmaster of St Peter's Church, Barford near Warwick. He will play works by J S Bach, Couperin and Handel.
